The gallery is located in the historic Grovewood Village complex, which once housed the weaving and woodworking operations of Biltmore Industries, a force in American craft and textiles that grew to become one of the largest producers of handwoven wool. Today, the gallery offers two expansive floors of fine American-made art and crafts contributed by more than 350 makers from across the United States.

Blue Spiral 1 in Asheville, NC, Offers Exhibition Focused on Bonsai Trees

Blue Spiral 1 in Asheville, NC, will present *Beyond the Horizon*, featuring Bonsai as Fine Art, on view in the Main Level Gallery, from June 2 - 11, 2023. A reception will be held on June 2, from 5-8pm. On June 3, at 2pm, the gallery will offer "Transforming Plant Material into Fine Art," with a Bonsai styling demonstration with Bjorn Bjorholm.

Bonsai comes indoors and heads to Blue Spiral 1 for an extraordinary ten-day Bonsai as Fine Art exhibition; the first of its kind in Asheville. The show includes 20 works by professional bonsai artists and members of the Blue Ridge Bonsai Society.

Special events and educational programs are planned during the run of *Beyond the Horizon*, at Blue Spiral 1 and The North Carolina Arboretum. A culminating weekend at the Arboretum invites visitors to enjoy the Bonsai Exhibition Garden, where fine art, landscape design,

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Mark Bettis Gallery in Asheville, NC, Features Works by Nabil El Jaouhari

The Mark Bettis Gallery, located in the Wedge Studios in Asheville, NC, is presenting *The Impermanence of Things*, featuring works by Nabil El Jaouhari, on view through June 24, 2023. A reception will be held on June 10, from 5:30-7:30pm.

Nabil El Jaouhari's second solo show at the Mark Bettis Gallery showcases work inspired by the Japanese concept of "Mono No Aware," translated as "an empathy towards things," or "the pathos of things." The show highlights the concept through its biomorphic and organic forms that remind one of nature. Using unconventional raw materials like tar and asphaltum combined with his signature wood burning and a limited palette, the paintings have a light and an ethereal quality that stands as a reminder of the ephemeral quality of life and nature.

Originally from Lebanon, El Jaouhari studied fine arts at the Lebanese University in Beirut before moving to the United States in 2009 to complete his MFA in painting and printmaking at the University of Missouri
