people that have been here in the past, is part of the present, and constructs a prominent future. I believe my artworks belong to the Southern region and are part of the American Painting's journey that started thousands of years ago, survived the European encounter, adapted to the modernist twenty-century, and are embedded now with our digital contemporaneity."

Renzo Ortega (Lima, Peru 1974) is an artist based in Carrboro, NC. He received a BFA in painting from the Escuela Nacional de Bellas Artes del Peru (1999), studied at the Art Students League of New York (2000-04) and has his MFA in painting from Hunter College (2014). His artwork has been exhibited in solo and group shows in the United States and Peru, and has been commissioned to create public art projects and community murals.

Ortega's recent solo exhibitions have been at TW Fine Art in Palm Beach (2022) and LUMP Gallery in Raleigh, NC (2021). Renzo's artwork has been exhibited in museums such as the NASHER Museum of Art (Durham, NC, 2022), Southeastern Center for Contemporary Art SECCA (Winston-Salem, NC, 2020), the Works on Paper: 2017 Exhibition at The Weatherspoon Art Museum in Greensboro, in the S- Files Biennial at El Museo del Barrio (New York 2007) and Queens International Biennial at the Queens Museum in 2006.

Ortega is a recipient of the 2018-2019 North Carolina Arts Council Artist Fellowship Award, 2018- 2019 Ella Fountain Pratt Emerging Artists Grant Durham Arts Council, 2018 Orange County Arts Commission Artist Project Grant and 2016 Queens Council on the Arts New Work Award. In 2013, as a Kossak Travel Grant recipient, Ortega traveled to Berlin to study German Expressionism, and also in 2015 traveled to Honduras as a part of the US Department of Cultural Affairs Cultural Envoy Program. He partook in the Visiting Artist Residency at the Rubenstein Arts Center at Duke University in 2019, and In 2020, he was the inaugural artist of the New Wave Art Wknd artist-inresidence program in West Palm Beach.

University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, NC, Offers Exhibition Focused on Peck Collection

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, NC, is presenting *Focus on the Peck Collection: Studying with Rembrandt*, on view at the Ackland Art Museum, through Aug. 6, 2023.

Rembrandt van Rijn understood drawing as the foundation of the visual arts. This Focus on the Peck Collection installation presents works by Rembrandt, Philips de Koninck, and Abraham Furnerius that illustrate and exemplify the drawing exercises Rembrandt assigned his pupils. Through the completion of these exercises, students perfected their ability to draw from life and learned to create naturalistic images and compositions in the style of their master.

In January 2017, the Ackland Art Museum received its largest gift to date when Sheldon Peck (UNC-Chapel Hill, BS '63, DDS '66) and his wife Leena donated their extraordinary collection of 134 mostly 17th-century Dutch and Flemish master drawings, as well as significant funds for the stewardship of the collection, new acquisitions, and an endowed curatorial position in European and American art before 1950. At least one example from the collection is always on view at the Museum, but because these works of art on paper are light-sensitive, we rotate a select number of drawings with other objects from our permanent collection in an ongoing display called Focus on the Peck Collection.

Sheldon Peck, a native of Durham, is a double alumnus of the University, receiving his undergraduate degree from Carolina in 1963 and his doctorate from the UNC School of Dentistry in 1966. He and Leena enjoyed distinguished careers as prominent orthodontic specialists and educators in the Boston area.

The Peck Collection started as a collaboration between Sheldon and his late brother Harvey and continued as a joint interest

shared with Leena. The result of over 40 years of exceptional connoisseurship, scientifically rigorous analysis, and dedicated pursuit, the Peck Collection stands as an internationally significant achievement. Sadly, Leena Peck passed away in January of 2019, followed by Sheldon Peck in April of 2021.
