an entire series of work. This body of work conveys simple found objects that inspire minimal or complex linear forms.

Brian was born in Beaufort, SC, but was raised in Western Pennsylvania. He graduated in 1993 from Indiana University of Pennsylvania with a BA in Studio Art. He moved to Wilmington, NC, in 1995. He studied ceramics through the Continuing Education program at Cape Fear Community College while searching for an outlet for artistic expression. Brian studied under a Japanese-American Potter, Hiroshi Sueyoshi. He is currently serving as President of the Coastal Carolina Clay Guild.

Local artist and potter, Dianne Evans, has had a passion for art since childhood. She was born and raised in scenic Indiana, Pennsylvania. She developed an interest in art while studying under an inspirational high school art teacher. This experience also inspired her to want to become a teacher. Dianne earned a BS in Elementary Education from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1994. In 1995 she moved to Wilmington where she began teaching in several private schools. Although she is no longer teaching, she works at the University of North Carolina Wilmington. Continuing her love of art, she took art classes at UNC Wilmington in 2009-2010 where she focused on sculpture and ceramics. A field trip to Penland School of Crafts sparked an interest in pursuing ceramics as an art form. Dianne is an active member of the Coastal Carolina Clay Guild and participates in local art shows.

Festival of Public Art will showcase 60 outdoor, bold works of art throughout the downtown areas of Chapel Hill, Carrboro, and Hillsborough, NC - and the exact locations of the artwork can now be viewed at (uproarfestnc.com).

In addition to the online map, physical maps will be distributed at the festival's two welcome centers: the Chapel Hill/ Orange County Welcome Center at 308 W. Franklin Street in Chapel Hill and the Eno Arts Mill at 437 Dimmocks Mill Rd., Suite 17, in Hillsborough.

Uproar is free and accessible to all. The outdoor locations are easy to navigate, and audio descriptions are offered for individuals with low vision. A free trolley will be provided on Saturdays from noon to 8pm, and transportation for individuals with mobility challenges will be provided by Orange County Department of Transportation. Go to the festival's website for more information.

Artists from North Carolina, South Carolina, Arkansas, and Georgia were selected to participate in the inaugural fes-

pieces, sculptures, projection, and installations. A sign accompanying each artwork will have a QR code taking visitors to a scoring page. More than \$27,000 in cash prizes are up for grabs - the People's Choice winner will receive \$10,000, while the jury's first-place winner will receive \$10,000, the second-place winner will receive \$5,000, and a third-place winner will receive \$2,500. The jurors are Larry Wheeler, retired director of the North Carolina Museum of Art; Stacey L. Kirby, installation artist and the winner of ArtPrize 8; and interdisciplinary awardwinning artist Antoine Williams.

The Town of Hillsborough has announced an Uproar Purchase Award, committing to purchase one work by an Uproar artist. The Town of Chapel Hill has committed to an Uproar Commission Award: An Uproar artist will be hired during the 2023-24 fiscal year to create a custom work for the town.
